POSITION	TIME COMMITMENT	BRIEF DESCRIPTION
Program Operations	3 hours per week during academic year	A program ops volunteer assists with the various daily operations of the evening program at HQ or SBRC. This includes: the set-up of meeting spaces, speech tournament logistics, support with student registration for events, distributing room supplies, hosting activities (e.g. pre-program at 5pm), and assisting with end-of-night dismissal.
Lead Tutor - College Town	3 hours per week during academic year	A lead tutor (a.k.a. Room Advisor) facilitates the evening study room and serves as the leader for designated tasks during nightly program such as: check-ins with students, sharing announcements, welcoming new tutors in the room, student paperwork collection, tutoring and mentoring of students. The lead tutor helps to shape the study room culture and must demonstrate a high level of consistency and commitment to attending each week on their program night. Additional training is provided.
Tutor - College Town	3 hours per week during academic year	A College Town tutor provides weekly academic tutoring to students in the program. The tutor takes an interest in all aspects of the students' lives (academics and non-academic) and builds positive, trusting relationships to motivate students to strive for success.
Tutor - College Apps Academy	3 hours per week during academic year	An Academy tutor provides support to Academy Instructor staff by assisting students with personal essay review and editing, college applications, and financial aid applications (e.g. FAFSA, scholarships, etc.) and more.
Tutor - Juvenile Hall Program	3 hours per week during academic year	A juvenile hall program tutor provides academic tutoring to youth currently on probation; takes an interest in all aspects of the students' lives (academics and non-academic) and builds positive, trusting relationships to motivate students to strive for success.

Community Service Leader	5 hours per month (on weekends)	A community service leader guides and inspires students to get involved in their community by helping to chaperone and engage with students at various community service events (e.g. beach clean-up). Community service leaders have the special opportunity to attend other weekend and/or ad hoc event opportunities with our students (e.g. sports events, theatre, etc.). Must have reliable transportation!
Job Shadow Host*	3-5 hours, once per year	A job shadow host provides students with a career exploration opportunity by hosting student(s) at his/her worksite. Shares expertise and their story by giving students a sample "day in the life" in their particular job or education field. Job Shadow Week is traditionally held during Spring Break. Meals Volunteer*	Varies	A meals volunteer prepares and helps serve meals at program (from 6-7pm), or hosts a virtual food drive fundraiser.
Delegation Mentor	Varies	A delegation mentor helps chaperone at student delegation events (occasional evenings, weekends); or serves as a presenter or guest speaker at a delegation meeting/training(s); serves as a personal mentor and is matched 1x1 with a student delegate. Student delegates are students who've been elected to serve as peer leaders and ambassadors of Reality Changers.
Annual Events*	Varies, one-time events	An event volunteer provides day-of logistics and support to our annual events, including but not limited to: Malin Burnham Awards, Scholarship Celebration, Level Up Conference, Leadership Camp, and more!
Group + Corporate Opportunities*	Varies	We invite large groups and/or companies to get their members or employees involved with Reality Changers! Some of our group offerings include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alumni Care Package creation (annual event in November) • Graduate mini gift bags creation (annual event in June) • Joint community service opportunities with students • Customized event depending on group size and engagement (and # of employees)
